PAGLC was created to facilitate collaboration and the sharing of ideas about grazing in PA. As such, we have created an extensive, and extremely important, network of partners. Including:

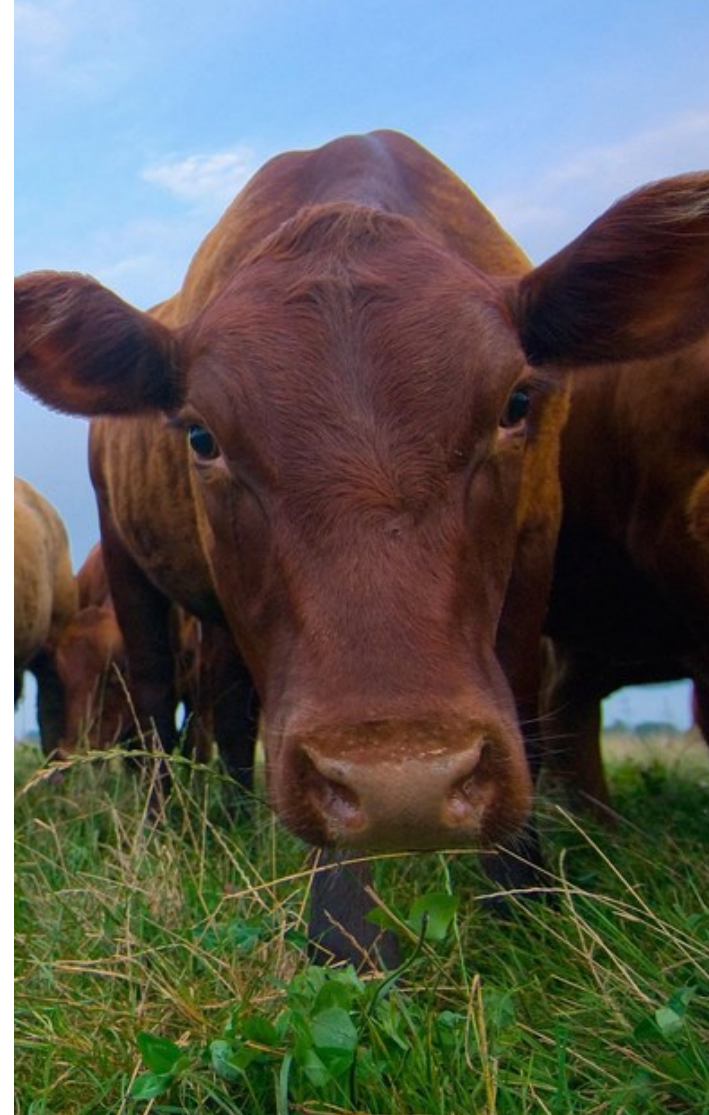
