Previous Activities:

- Aug/Sept. 2021. (more planned for 2022) Bovine Banter podcast. Various grazing dairy farmers
 were interviewed about their grazing practiced. Topics included: how to treat your pastures for
 optimum growth, intensive grazing, hybrid grazing models, and regulations around grazing dairy

 Barragan.
- October 19. "Managing Intensive Grazing of Cover Crops for Soil Health and Profitability" presented by Divya Pant at Keystone Crops and Soils Conference. Discussed soil biology and physical properties in relation to grazing cover crops as well as some economic analysis.
- October 21. "Grazing Cover Crops bang or bust?" presented by Sjoerd Duiker at No-Till &
 Cover Crop Implementation Field Workshop at Rutger's Snyder Research Farm in Pittstown, NJ.
 Discussed the benefits of how grazing cover crops can increase the overall benefits of the cover crop while also looking into potential for compaction.
- October 27. Penn State Dairy Nutrition Conference in Hershey, Dauphin County. C. Becker. Conference included a session on how to design and what to include in a grazing plan.
